Locally popular as Lellama (Lel-La-Ma), it is the second largest fish market in the country. It is situated at the north end of the Negombo Lagoon and can be seen across the lagoon bridge. Approximately 4,000 boats depart to sea from here every day. Starting from 3:30am, the market is busy and thriving throughout the day, with individuals vending and bargaining over fish.



- Travel down to Club Bentota on Highway El

<u>Club Bentota</u> is built in 1982 by South African architect, John Drake on a peninsula referred to as "Paradise Island" and is between the Indian Ocean and the Bentota River. Guests are welcome to have fun under the sun with jet skiing, windsurfing, beach volleyball, river boat cruises and many more.

2 Nine Arch Bridge

The glorious Nine Arch Bridge between Ella and Demodara station is one of the engineering marvels in the early 20th century. This bridge, which is almost 100 years old, has been built with blocks of stone and cement without any strengthening iron or concrete. The giant arches take the bridge on a curved path to link to the mountains. The Bridge was commissioned in 1921 under the British Government.

The Construction of this bridge comes with an interesting story.....

Once the World War I broke out and the steel consignment allocated for this site was seized and used for war-related projects. When the work came to a stoppage, the Sri Lankan (named Appuhami) came forward and built the bridge with solid stone bricks and cement without steel.

Q Flying Ravana Mega Zipline

Looking for an adrenaline kick you'll never forget? Soar through the air on South Asia's fastest mega zip line offered by Flying Ravana – a hair-raising ride you have to experience to believe.

Flying Ravana is Sri Lanka's first-ever mega dual zip-line, located amidst the luscious green estates of Ella, Sri Lanka. (near Little Adams Peak - Ella's main attraction) The two-wire zip-line stretches for more than half a kilometre (Length 550m), slides at max 80kmph, and offers a bird's-eye view of the beautiful hills of the island. This 1-hour Flying Ravana Experience gives you an exclusive adventure enthusiast experience.





- Travel to Nuwara Eliya by train.
- Stay at Ashford Hotel
- Ashford Hotel is located in the foothills of the scenic Hakkgala Mountains, 2 km from Lake Gregory. It offers a 24-hour reception and a restaurant serving international and Sri Lankan cuisine.



Q Kandy

Sri Lanka's second largest city after Colombo, located in the central hills, Kandy is a historic city of the highest religious and cultural importance. It was the last capital of Sinhalese kings until it fell into the hands of the British in 1815. Kandy remains the most sacred Buddhist site in Sri Lanka, perhaps the religious capital of Buddhism since it is the home of the Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic (Sri Dalada Maligawa) - the most venerated Buddhist shrine in the world - and this historic sacred site was declared a world heritage site by UNESCO in 1988.



9 <u>Victoria Dam</u>



Considered the crown jewel of the Mahaweli Development Project, The Victoria Dam (the tallest Dam in Sri Lanka) is built at a deep valley just above the Victoria Falls rapids and 300 meters below the point where the Hulu Ganga meets the Mahaveli River. The construction of the dam began in 1978 and was ceremoniously opened in 1985 which was graced by Margaret Thatcher, then prime minister of the UK. The funding, design and technical expertise were provided by the United Kingdom and the project's most memorable event was recorded when Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II visited the construction site on October 24, 1981.


Day 9 & 10

2 <u>Sigiriya</u>



Sigiriya, often referred to as the "Eighth Wonder of the World," is a UNESCO World Heritage site that stands as a testament to Sri Lanka's ancient ingenuity. This massive rock fortress, built by King Kashyapa in the 5th century to hide from his brother's attacks, towers 200 meters above the surrounding jungle. After the king's death, the Sigiriya named as a Buddhist monastery until the 14th century. As you ascend its stairways, you'll steep encounter breathtaking frescoes, the famous Mirror Wall, and remnants of royal gardens. At the summit, explore the ruins of an ancient palace while enjoying panoramic views of the lush countryside. Sigiriya combines history, art, and nature, offering unforgettable experience for all who visit.
